

Grant Application Procedure Group HM Foundation

To submit a project proposal to the HM Group Foundation, applicants must comply with the following steps:

1. **Project Submission:** Submit a formal application (either electronically or physically) accompanied by a detailed project description.
2. **Budget Transparency:** Provide an accurate line-item budget, clearly indicating any funding already secured from other sources.
3. **Eligibility Criteria:** Grants are strictly reserved for legal entities. The project must be implemented by a duly registered organization holding an official operating license.

Completed Projects

1. Canapé Vert Hospital

In March 2025, 13-year-old Joseph Shoob suffered a severe traumatic brain injury during a school recess in Jacmel. Although he initially recovered and resumed his daily activities, his condition tragically worsened last December. Following a high fever and epileptic seizures, Joseph slipped into a coma that lasted more than three weeks. Due to the lack of specialized medical facilities in his region, an emergency transfer to Port-au-Prince became vital. Despite his parents' financial hardships, a wave of solidarity made his transfer possible.

The HM Group Foundation stepped in by granting a subsidy to the Canapé-Vert Hospital to fully cover his hospitalization costs for two months and fund his medical treatment. Thanks to this decisive intervention, Joseph Shoob is now safe and sound back home. He is currently undergoing therapy alongside his family to help him recover and return to a normal life.



2. Haïti TEC

In Haiti, access to education is a major driver of development. Haïti TEC, a local organization dedicated to youth education, has developed a sponsorship program aimed at providing 100 vulnerable young people with free access to high-quality technical and vocational training over a two-year period.

Committed to their future, **the HM Group Foundation** has partnered with this initiative by directly sponsoring 10 of these young students. Thanks to this two-year grant, these students will be able to acquire essential skills and effectively prepare to enter the job market.

3. Association Haïtienne des citoyens pour le développement

Changing lives by restoring sight: this is the challenge that a team of qualified doctors took on by uniting within this association. Their goal is to perform 50 pediatric eye surgeries to save children suffering from congenital cataracts from blindness.

Deeply moved by this medical emergency, **the HM Group Foundation** is actively supporting this initiative. The Foundation has awarded a grant to the Association Haïtienne des Citoyens pour le Développement (Haitian Citizens' Association for Development), led by Dr. Yamilee Cherubin, to fully cover the costs of these surgical procedures in Haiti.



4. Ti Souf / Fondation IDEO

Thanks to the dedication of educator Maguy Clérié and psychologist Roseline Benjamin, children from disadvantaged backgrounds who are facing rampant insecurity manage to keep a glimmer of hope alive.

To support this vital initiative, **the HM Group Foundation** is funding the psychological support project titled "POUR UNE CULTURE DE L'AMOUR ET DE LA PAIX" (For a Culture of Love and Peace).

This funding provides the youth of Canaan with a safe, caring, and welcoming environment to gather. Additionally, support is offered to local teachers, equipping them with the necessary tools to provide emotional support to these children and shield them from the influence of armed groups.



5. APAAC

The Association pour la Prévention de l'Alcoolisme et autres Accoutumances Chimiques (APAAC) is a Haitian non-profit organization that has been combating substance abuse since November 1986. Its dual mission focuses on preventing and treating alcoholism and other addictions, with a special emphasis on youth.

Through information and awareness programs, APAAC helps the population adopt sustainable, empowering behaviors in the face of drug-related dangers. The organization also offers therapeutic support to help individuals battling addiction recover and reclaim a healthy life.

To support this commitment to the youth, **the HM Group Foundation** has awarded a grant to APAAC to deploy targeted awareness campaigns across 40 schools.

6. SLG

The SLG Academy (Saint-Louis de Gonzague) is a leading Haitian sports academy, distinguished by its excellent football program and its collaboration with the Haitian Basketball Federation. Active across the country, it energizes the youth through the frequent organization of tournaments and competitions.

Committed to supporting this institution, **the HM Group Foundation** has awarded a grant aimed at strengthening four of the academy's essential pillars: the final compensation of personnel (coaching and administrative staff), academic tutoring for young athletes, medical care for injured or sick sports players, and the purchase of equipment for all disciplines.

7. CNTS / U4WE

Located in Port-au-Prince, the National Blood Transfusion Center (CNTS) is the public institution managed by the Ministry of Public Health and Population (MSPP). Responsible for collecting, testing, and distributing blood products in Haiti, the CNTS's primary mission is to ensure transfusion safety, organize blood drives, and supply hospitals. Today, the institution faces major challenges tied to insecurity: a national network heavily impacted by a shortage of blood bags, and crises of violence that disrupt both the transportation of medical supplies and the organization of blood drives.

In response to this humanitarian emergency, **the HM Group Foundation** in collaboration with the United for Women Empowerment foundation is providing its support by organizing a blood drive directly within the group's premises.

Through this initiative, the HM Group reaffirms its civic commitment and social responsibility toward the community. Together, we bring a glimmer of hope: *"Nou se Ayisyen, nou se yon sèl san"* (We are Haitians, we are one blood).

8. FONDAPS

The Fondation Notre-Dame du Perpétuel Secours (FONDAPS) is a non-profit organization based in Haiti whose mission is to educate a large number of children from various neighborhoods in the capital through sports. Furthermore, the foundation aims to bring these young people together, allowing them to share their daily lives and thrive through their training.

The organization places a special emphasis on sports principles such as fair play, teamwork, and respect for both coaches and opponents, with the conviction that these values transcend the athletic field and integrate into the daily lives of these youths. FONDAPS firmly believes that instilling a sense of civic duty, respect for others, and a spirit of brotherhood will encourage them to become responsible citizens in the future.

To accompany the organization in its mission, **the HM Group Foundation** provides monthly support aimed at covering its various administrative needs.

9. Paroisse St Louis Marie Grignon de Monfort

Located in Delmas 31, Port-au-Prince, the Paroisse Saint-Louis-Marie Grignon de Montfort is a cornerstone Catholic community in the capital. Founded in 1999 and entrusted to the Montfortian Fathers congregation, the parish is well-known for its vibrant spirit, particularly during its patronal feast celebrated every April.

To support the organization of this major event, **the HM Group Foundation** provided a financial contribution specifically earmarked to cover sound system expenses. In addition to this punctual support, the HM Group Foundation provides the parish with a monthly donation of 20 cases of pasta.

10. Institut de danse Karol Ann Vilaire

The Karol-Ann Vilaire Dance Academy will present its 2026 Annual Show on Saturday, June 20, 2026, at the Karibe Convention Center. This special edition will mark 25 years of artistic excellence with an exclusive production inspired by "The Lion King." Each year, this event draws a large audience, highlighting the talent, hard work, and discipline of the many young dancers trained at the institution.

Beyond its artistic mission, the academy operates at the heart of a community often faced with severe hardships, including illness, lack of medical care, food insecurity among the elderly, and parents' inability to fund their children's education.

In response to these realities, and even more so within the current context of insecurity, the institution is actively committed to social initiatives supporting the neighborhood's most vulnerable residents. **The HM Group Foundation** provides its valuable support, enabling the academy to successfully carry out these various outreach activities, which notably include:

Covering tuition fees and distributing school supply kits.

Organizing psychological support sessions (trauma management) as well as personal and dental hygiene workshops.

Integrating vulnerable youth into the dance school, with full coverage of their uniforms and stage outfits.

11. Hôpital Universitaire la Paix

A cornerstone of public healthcare in Haiti, the Hôpital Universitaire de la Paix (HUP) is currently the main affordable medical haven for Port-au-Prince's vulnerable population, following the closure of the General Hospital. In addition to its healthcare mission, HUP plays a key role in training the next generation of medical professionals.

A site visit revealed the robustness of its clinical organization as well as its remarkable technical autonomy (including on-site oxygen production, water treatment, and waste management). The facility also benefits from the support of partners such as the International Red Cross and Barban court for its infrastructure modernization.

To support the outstanding work of the healthcare teams, **the HM Group Foundation** has officially handed over a major donation of medical and protective equipment to the institution, featuring more than 14,000 gowns, 130,000 masks, 1,500 hazmat suits, along with essential medical supplies such as scrubs and Betadine.



12. Association Haïtienne des citoyens pour le développement

The HM Group Foundation team conducted a site visit for the Association Haïtienne des Citoyens pour le Développement project, which focuses on performing 50 pediatric eye surgeries.

By attending a two-hour procedure (including preparation time), the Foundation was able to witness firsthand the exceptional commitment and compassion of the medical team. This deeply moving experience highlighted the immense dedication and humanity of these healthcare professionals. By generously donating their expertise and time, these doctors are transforming lives and restoring hope and a brighter future for the most vulnerable families.
